Physical disability and blindness are the only two reasons a voter may apply to the county board of elections for permanent voting assistance. A person may receive assistance from someone of his or her choice or the two election officers at the polls. A person may not be assisted by his or her employer, the employer's agent, a union officer or an agent of that voter's union.

O: Do I need identification to vote?

A: Yes, Election officers are supposed to ask you to provide ID, unless they know you. In Kentucky, a driver's license, voter identification card, credit card or Social Security card will work. An election officer who knows you also can vouch for you.
